# FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

I was recently reading a section of JOHN PAUL II ENCYLICAL HOLY SPIRIT from the VATICAN **COUNCIL TRINITY LITURGY** and was moved profoundly by the description of the power of the Holy Spirit which proceeds from God our Father and his son Jesus Christ. Out of this encyclical I developed my new year's resolution which I would like to share with you.

Saint Paul in his letter to the Galatians speaks of "the fruit of the Spirit," such as "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and selfcontrol." Happy New Year to everyone! I hope that your Christmas holiday was joyous and peaceful! Again, God has blessed us with a temporary reprieve from winter and every afternoon, it stays lighter a little longer.

#### 2013-14 Registration

Registration for the 2013-14 school year begins soon. The information meeting for prospective JK and K parents, and anyone interested in other grades will be on Jan. 22 at 7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. Parish registration for JK and K will be after all masses on Jan. 26 and 27 at the school office. Birth and baptismal certificates and immunization records must be presented at that time. JK students MUST be 4-years-old and K students MUST be 5-years-old ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 31, 2013 as required by NC state law. ALL JK STUDENTS currently enrolled at St. Peter's School MUST re-apply for Kindergarten that weekend. In school re-registration begins Jan. 28. Please check the church bulletin for more information.

#### High School Registration

Eighth grade registration for high school begins this month as well. On Jan. 8 some faculty, staff, and students from JPII High School gave a presentation of the academic program as well as the social and spiritual life at their school to the 8th grade. On Jan. 28 Rose, Conley, and South Central High Schools will be here for their registration overview. Eighth grade parents, watch for more info to follow.

#### March for Life

On Jan. 25 our 8th graders and some of the faculty and staff will participate in the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. They will leave the afternoon before so that they will be able to participate in a youth rally the evening before the March. They will also attend Mass at the Basilica with Bishop Burbidge on Friday morning prior to the March.

Per the updated policy, all tardies are counted as unexecused unless a doctor's note is presented. The policy allows for those unexpected, RARE situations. Please refer to the parent/student handbook for the guidelines and consequences.

There is much sickness in the school this time of year. If your child is sick, please keep them at home. Before they return to school

they must be free of fever or from vomiting for 24 hours. Remember to send an absence note upon their return...and wash hands frequently!

#### **School Uniforms**

Make sure that your child has the correct school uniform each day. There are students not wearing uniform shorts and pants. The only acceptable outerwear (in the classroom) is SPS crewneck sweatshirts and hoodies (for MS). Refer to the parent/student handbook for the uniform vendors (we have a few new ones).

Please do NOT bring in lunches from outside vendors, even for special occasions.




